2806 Apologies

2807 Declaration of Interest

2808 Public Participation

PC Stockhill reported there is an improvement in Rural Crimes (despite another 4 x 4 being stolen from Compton Bassett recently). Parents from Cherhill School have been sent letters and a follow up letter will be issued soon. 2 Fines of £100 have been issued recently. Yellow Lines would solve problem of parking on corners. Clerk to follow this up – contact Martin Cook. County Councillor A Hill said it was important to get application for lines in even if we are bottom of the list. Mrs Henshaw informed the meeting that as a representative of CATG she supported fines and said there was no funding for lines. A parking Survey is needed to identify needs and establish need. John Cavanagh agreed with this P C Stockhill left the meeting at this point

Mrs Henshaw stated the minute reference 2797 was not correct – it should read 'It was reported that' not understood that. This was amended on minutes by the Chairman Cllr D Grafton

Mrs Henshaw wished to know what Landscaping has been agreed for the Airfield, she also queried 106 monies – Clerk to contact Mark Staincliffe.

Councillor A Hill stated the Landscaping needs to be agreed prior to commencement of building on the site

Mr R Watkins complained again about Broadband for Yatesbury – Clerk to draft a letter to James Gray

J Cavanagh was under the impression that Communications was to be an agenda item from November. This will now be a Standard Agenda Item before Village Matters

Hills Lower Compton Permanent extension to Building

Councillors discussed this new application fully. The existing facility is due to expire at end December 2016 leaving Landfill only. Cllr A Hill reported that the previous applications have not been withdrawn. This is an inappropriate site at

the end of a country lane and next to a village. Waste would need to be brought in (and out again) from all over the country meaning far more lorry movements. Far better to be situated nearer the M4 motorway. Cherhill Parish Council will object to this application

2812 Driving and Parking issues by Cherhill School

The Police are taking positive action. Councillors agreed yellow lines appear to be the only answer. Both the Police and Terry Hall (Headmistress) are doing all they can to try and find an answer to help the issue.

2813 Rights of Way – Countryside Access Meeting

Cllr D Grafton reported on the success of this first meeting when over 75 people attended. We greatly appreciated Richard Broadhead attending. There were 17 Locations highlighted on the map provided at the meeting. Cllr B Seed will send out notes and appendix from meeting to all interested parties.

Cllr M Wilkins reported on the damage done by 4 x 4's around Yatesbury. He reported a number come over from Belgium on organized trips – some have no respect and ruin it for other users. Clerk to contact Dale Wyatt of LARA

John Cavanagh to set up a forum for Countryside Access. The second meeting will be end of January or early February – date to be arranged

Cllr A Hill suggested we apply to Area Board for funding for Rights of Way – Agenda item for Precept Meeting

2817 Village Matters

Cllr M Wilkins has requested that the Notice Boards need refurbishing. It was agreed that all the notice boards in both villages need attention plus the notice by the Pond at Yatesbury – Clerk to contact ‘odd job man’ for quote

Cllr M Wilkins queried why the fencing was not going to be removed by Will Woodland in the foreseeable future. Cllr D Grafton stated this land is private property – we are not entitled to a say in the matter

Cllr M Wilkins has concern that nothing is going to be done to road junction when the new build/restorations take place – Highways happy with present markings

Cllr D Evans is concerned that nothing has been done to the bridge railings in Mill Lane. This has been reported to both Martin Cook and Tracy Ruse by the Clerk – Clerk to pursue and get definite answer

Cllr S Tomlinson has electronic copy of Compton Bassett’s Neighbourhood Plan. He re-iterated the comments that David Way had made at meeting with him when he checked the core strategy documents. Cllr S Tomlinson to email David Way for further clarification as to why we do not need a NP

Wiltshire Council has written to all the Parish Councils stating that each Parish would need to pay at least £600 to have the speed sign indicator installed every so often. Cllr D Grafton to report to Focus on Five and ascertain other Parishes views.

Cllr M Purslow reported that the road hatching had still not been done on the A4 by Yatesbury – Clerk to report to Martin Cook

The Oak log seats in both villages really need replacing – Precept for this at meeting on 10th December
