Wiltshire Councillor A Hill reported he had just been advised that the application for 3 houses at Cedarwood Middle Lane Cherhill has been withdrawn. The Agent will shortly be submitting new planning application for 2 houses

Councillor A Hill also commented on the Virador application. The methane will be captured above ground and toxic fluids will be taken away to a toxic fluid treatment plant. It will take 50 years settlement for the 10 metres estimated

Councillor A Hill informed us that Hills are proposing 3 new applications under section 73 to be made permanent. These should go before Strategic Planning end January/February time.

Cllr D Grafton reported that the day had been very successful and the weather was fine. This time all the work was done at various parts of Yatesbury.

#### 3075 Cherhill Emergency Plan

It was suggested that we may be able to feed in with Calne. There is a Focus on Five Meeting arranged for 24<sup>th</sup> November and this will be discussed at that meeting

#### 3076 Village Matters

It was noted that Balfour Beatty have pulled out of their contract with Wiltshire Council who will now do some of the work 'in house' but are keeping the sub contractors in place

Due to the time of the A4 Tourist Group meeting and the date unfortunately no-one was available to go from the Parish Council

A Resident in the village and her Daughter were walking along Jugglers Lane one evening when a vehicle drove up Jugglers Lane from Cherhill and due to the narrow nature of the Lane they had to clamber in to the bushes to get out of the way. Could drivers please take care in the dark and especially narrow sections as many people use this Lane. Unfortunately it was too dark to get the registration number

Distraction Burglary near Marlborough was reported. Persons called on residents with map asking for directions and were then burgled

Unfortunately Hare Coursing is still taking place at Yatesbury and also Calstone. Anyone seeing evidence of this please phone 999

The 106 money due to the Parish Council is £7400 and this does not expire until 2019. Since new changes to CIL (Community Infrastructure Levy) this can now be used for different projects.

It was agreed due to the wet weather the Right of Way from Red Barn to the National Trust Land will be closed with immediate effect. Clerk to inform the Landlords Ainsleys and Bells who so kindly agreed to it being used for Horseriders from the Spring. Cllr D Grafton to put up notice
