### 3114 Speed Limit in Cherhill and Yatesbury

Cllr D Evans reported that the new 20mph speed limit signs will be implemented in the summer by the new Council Contractor. Apparently it would cost £2500.00 just to assess Marsh Lane. Discussion then took place regarding Yatesbury Speed Limits. We will get 2 Village signs, one to go at Vulpit Cottages and the other at Nolands. Cllr D Grafton suggested white gates could help and he will look in to the cost – April agenda
